information is readily available on Shriner's Children's website, but I am more than happy to bring it to you personally.

Kandace Stratton, the new nurse manager of surgical services at Shriners Children's Lexington, is a familiar face around the medical center.

She has not only been working at <u>Shriner</u> <u>Children's Lexington</u> for 15 years, but she started her journey as a patient when she was a preteen.

When Kandace was 11, her pediatrician discovered she had <u>scoliosis</u> and referred her to Shriners Children's for specialty care.

Kandace had adolescent idiopathic scoliosis. Idiopathic means the cause is unknown. **Idiopathic scoliosis** can run in families, affects girls more often than boys, and is one of three types of scoliosis that causes the spine to develop an abnormal curve. This type of scoliosis typically appears after the age of 10.

For two years, Kandace wore a <u>thoracic lumbar</u> <u>sacral orthotic (TLSO) brace</u>. A TLSO brace is the most common type of brace worn for scoliosis. The brace is made of plastic and is contoured to conform to the body. Kandace wore the close-fitting brace for 23 hours a day in hopes of correcting her spinal curvature as she grew.

Unfortunately, the bracing was not effective for Kandace, and when she was 14, she ended up requiring **surgery** to permanently correct her curve.

Kandace, who had an S-shaped spinal curve, started with an anterior spinal fusion surgery to correct the curve at the lower part of her back in hopes that the upper curve would correct itself. Eventually, she needed a posterior spinal fusion to correct the top of her spine as well.

Just five years after recovering from her own spinal fusion surgery, Kandace came to work at Shriners Children's Lexington as a certified nursing assistant (CNA) in the inpatient unit, helping other kids recover from their own surgeries.

She said her time as a patient at Shriners Children's inspired her career choice.

"Working at Shriners feels like a full-circle moment for me," she said. "I didn't want to be a nurse until I started coming to Shriners. I hated that I had scoliosis as a kid, but working at Shriners Children's now has brought purpose behind it. Having scoliosis led me to this job and this career that I love. I would not have it any other way."

Kandace changed from being a CNA to working as a registered nurse in the inpatient unit, and when Shriners Children's Lexington moved to its new state-of-the-art medical center in 2017, she switched to working in the post-anesthesia care unit (PACU) in the ambulatory surgery center (ASC).

In 2021, Kandace became the supervisor in the ASC, and was recently promoted to nurse manager of surgical services, where she also serves as the infection preventionist. In this new role, Kandace oversees all aspects of the ASC, including the operating rooms, pre- and postoperative rooms, and the PACU.

"Being a former patient amplifies the care she can provide as a nurse and a manager," she said.

"Having been in the shoes of our patients makes it easier to relate to them, and makes me more empathetic in my care for them," Kandace said. "When they are in pain, and I say, 'I know how you feel,' I really mean it because I have been there. I have been through the recovery process. I can tell them that I was in their shoes, and they can see where I am now and maybe have a little more hope."

The mission of Shriners Children's, and the people who work to fulfill that mission, are both special to Kandace.



Food for Thought

I don't know about you but my surroundings are pretty yellow right now. Spring is my absolute favorite season, but this pollen is next level. Spring brings forth the renewal from a bleak winter. Our sweet little Dogwood tree is blooming. The sight reminds me of the legend of the Dogwood tree.

Each bloom on a Dogwood tree has four petals, symbolizing a cross (as the legend tells it). Mom's Potato Salad

5 pounds russet potatoes or Yukon Gold 1-12 oz jar sweet pickle salad cubes (don't drain)

112 oz jar dill pickle cubes (drain & save liquid)

1 12 02 jui aiii pickie cubes (araiii

1 diced green pepper

1 large jar diced pimento (don't drain)

1.5 cups DUKES mayonnaise

1/2 cup yellow mustard

1 tablespoon apple cider vinegar

4-5 hard boiled eggs, peeled and chopped

3 - 4 celery stalks, diced

1 onion, diced

Salt and pepper to taste

Scrub potatoes and boil in enough water to cover until fork tender. Boil the potatoes whole - trust me .

Mix mayo, mustard, apple cider vinegar. Add reserved pickle juice 1 tbs at a time until desired taste.

Once the potatoes are very tender, drain off all the water. Remove the loose peels and chop the potatoes into 1/2-inch chunks. It's okay if they are soft and crumbly. Place the potatoes in a large bowl. Gently mix in the dressing until it coats the potatoes well. Then stir in the eggs, sweet pickles (with juice), dill cubes (drained), celery, onions, green pepper, and pimento. Taste, then salt and pepper as needed. Refrigerate. While immediately delicious it's even better the next day.

Red Fez Shrine Club vs. the Wild West!













Relationships - hurting people

From an early age we are told to love our enemies, to pray for those who persecute us, to turn the other cheek. Oh yes, and we are told: "Do not judge" and, most importantly, "Do to others as we would have done to us."

And many of us question: Is it possible to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek, to be merciful, and treat others as we would like to be treated?

Indeed, it is possible. In the Old Testament, we read of a young man by the name of Joseph. You remember Joseph who had the coat of many colors. Joseph's brothers were jealous of him-resented him and devised a plan to get rid of him. Ultimately, they sold him into slavery. BUT Joseph attracted the attention of the powers in Egypt, and he became the second most powerful person in the country.

Finally, Joseph had the opportunity to extend mercy to his brothers by supplying food to them. No judgment, only forgiveness. And, in the 50th Chapter of Genesis Joseph ultimately tells his brothers: "Even though you intended to do harm to me, God intended it for good…"

And, we question, "how hard is that?" Here he forgives his brothers for attempting to do away with him. Here we live in an "I don't have high blood pressure — I give high blood pressure" world, a pay-back, get-even, "what goes around comes around" world.

John Maxwell is a nationally-known teacher, a pastor and an author. His books primarily focus on leadership. In speaking about **RELATIONSHIPS**, John Maxwell says: *Hurting-people, hurt other people and are easily hurt by other people.*" Once more, *Hurting-people, hurt other people and are easily hurt by other people.*"


If we know that people who hurt us may themselves have hurts that are causing them to act in hurtful ways IT MAY HELP US WITH OUR RELATIONSHIPS. Perhaps they do not intend to hurt—they are much like a lion with a thorn in his paw. They just hurt all the time.

Let us remember: ONE: Hurting-people hurt people and are easily hurt by other people; TWO: We can hurt others when we are hurting. And THREE: In our prayer time, ask God if there someone for whom we need to pray to re-build a broken relationship.
