







































The Oasis Pickers Deliver Music and More



Petals of Hope: Shrine Patient Monthly Story

A Bloom of Determination, Forbes' Story


Like the delicate yet enduring dogwood blossom that flourishes even in rocky soil, Forbes' journey is a story of strength rooted in challenge—and beauty born from perseverance. Each petal of the dogwood, often said to symbolize rebirth and resilience, mirrors the milestones Forbes has reached in his young life.

Diagnosed with Russell-Silver syndrome, a rare condition marked by growth differences and orthopedic challenges, Forbes has faced more than his share of obstacles. But just as the dogwood tree finds a way to bloom each spring, Forbes has continued to

rise—steadied by expert care, unwavering support, and his own fierce determination.

From his first pair of orthotics at Shriners Children's Greenville to taking home trophies in gymnastics and discovering a passion for golf, Forbes lives a life in full bloom. The compassion and innovation of his care team have not only helped him walk taller, but have given him the freedom to dream bigger.

Forbes' story reminds us that even in life's most uncertain seasons, hope can take root—and with the right care, it can blossom into something extraordinary.



During a routine checkup, Forbes' pediatrician recommended that he visit Shriners Children's Greenville. Diagnosed with Russell-Silver syndrome, a rare condition characterized by growth restrictions affecting approximately 1 in 100,000 people, Forbes has faced various skeletal challenges, including scoliosis and a leg length

discrepancy. Despite these complexities, his mom describes his journey as one of resilience, strength, and a little bit of luck.

Forbes, now almost 9 years old, has been a patient at Shriners Children's Greenville for most of his life. With his grandfather being a dedicated Shriner, his family had long supported the hospital system —never expecting that one day, they too would benefit from its life-changing care.

"I've always had a soft spot for Shriners Children's, but I never thought I would need them," his mom, Jamie, shared.

Born with a need for specialized orthopedic care, Forbes was fitted with orthotics at an early age. At just 2 years old, he

faced a challenge many take for granted — finding shoes that fit over his orthotics. "When we came to get his first orthotics, we didn't even think to bring shoes that would be big enough to fit over them." Fortunately, Shriners Children's had the perfect pair, marking a small but significant milestone in his journey. "It was just another way Shriners Children's has always been there to help." Over the years, Forbes has worn a total of three sets of orthotics, including supramalleolar orthoses (SMOs) and ankle-foot orthoses (AFOs), each carefully designed to support his mobility and growth.

Under the care of his medical team, Forbes continues to be monitored for his scoliosis and leg length discrepancy. His treatment, combined with the assurance and expertise of his care team, has given him the confidence to pursue his many passions — golf, karate, gymnastics, and now basketball without fear. Forbes discovered his love for golf two years ago and hasn't looked back. Off the course, his competitive spirit shines in gymnastics, where he competes in the USAG HUGS program, designed for athletes with unique complexities. During his first competition, Forbes proudly took home three trophies, a testament to his determination and skill.

Forbes' family remains deeply grateful for the care he has received and continues to support Shriners Children's. "We feel lucky," Jamie shared, "knowing that with the hospital's expertise and compassion, Forbes will continue to thrive in every aspect of his life."












Oasis Shrine Circus 2025






