From the Recorder



Hello Everyone,

I hope this note finds you well. My next few articles will focus on our hospital kids, and I hope you enjoy

reading their stories. This month's focus is on Dennis. The following information is readily available on Shriners Children's website, but I am more than happy to bring it to you personally.

Specialized, family-centered care at Shriners Children's Chicago has helped Dennis overcome challenges due to cerebral palsy and thrive with confidence.

At just five years old, Dennis has a story of courage that stretches far beyond his small frame, a frame he moves and rolls independently, thanks to the advanced cerebral palsy care (CP) his family found at Shriners Children's Chicago.

Shortly after his first birthday, Dennis was diagnosed with spastic diplegia cerebral palsy by doctors in Michigan, where the family lives. Cerebral palsy is a condition that affects a child's muscle



tone, movement and coordination. In this case, the family was given little hope for their child's future. "When he was diagnosed, we were told he wouldn't walk, talk or speak, but we don't allow the word can't in our house. That was Papa's rule – you can do anything," proclaims Maria, Dennis' mother.

Hope Arrived after a Challenging Diagnosis

Maria and her husband, Dennis Jr., were approached by a friend at their church who is a Shriner. "We didn't know the process, but as soon as we called, we started to realize this was the best decision we made."

Dennis's first visit was in 2021, when he was a little over a year old. His pediatric orthopedic surgeon, Kelsey Davidson, M.D., has played a pivotal role in his care. "She was the first doctor he didn't cry with when she touched his legs during an exam," Maria said. "That told us everything we needed to know and, as a family, put us at ease." While working in partnership with rehabilitation professionals nearby, Shriners Children's Chicago has become a second home for this family. The staff provides specialized care for Dennis's spastic diplegia, which primarily affects his leg muscles and makes his gait different from that of a typical five-yearold. His visits, usually every six months, increased this year as he began more targeted treatments, including Dysport injections. Botulinum toxin is sometimes used in small doses as a treatment to reduce muscle spasticity.

"We're always looking to improve the standard of care and making sure we're offering the safest and best care for our patients with cerebral palsy and other orthopedics-related conditions," Dr. Davidson said. The family spent 18

months discussing the treatment with clinicians in Detroit and at Shriners Children's before moving forward.

"He's doing great," his dad said proudly. "After the Dysport, I stretched his ankles, and they weren't stiff like usual. He only complained a little about being sore."

He also had serial casting. The term "serial" is used because each cast is one in a series that progressively stretches the muscle or joint a bit further each time. Dad said the goal for Dennis is to stretch his tight calf muscles and help with the "scissoring" that causes his legs to cross over one another when he walks. "My feet stick out," Dennis said after first getting a cast on each leg from foot to mid-calf. Dennis brings color and joy to every visit, always excited to pick a new cast color. His most recent choice? Red - his favorite. "Why red?" someone asked. "Because I did," he answered confidently. His new wheelchair? Also red. "Red, red, red - with a splash of blue on the seat," his mom said with a smile.

To make the road trips more manageable, his parents traveled from the Detroit area to Shriners Children's Chicago every two weeks, instead of the typical weekly visits during casting.

Now, they share that story of Shriners Children's every chance they get - at restaurants, on the road, and with stickers on the back of their car. "Someone behind us might have a child with a disability," said his dad. "We want them to know help is out there."

Despite the medical hurdles, Dennis is thriving. "His vocabulary is beyond," his mom said. "The neurologist said he's at a six-year-old level." His determination is not just visible to his parents. "Dennis has made tremendous progress in four years. He is now using a walker along with his wheelchair. My next goal for Dennis is to move to elbow crutches, which will continue to improve his walking," said Dr. Davidson. There was once a time when Dennis's parents weren't sure he'd be able to walk or speak. Today, he's doing all that and more - smiling, playing and living life like any other five-year-old. Thanks to the compassionate, specialized cerebral palsy care at Shriners Children's Chicago, Dennis continues to grow – and there's no doubt his unstoppable spirit will carry him far.

Things continue to go well here at Oasis, and we would love to have your stop by and visit *your* temple. Take care until next month, and remember, the work you do for our fraternity and philanthropy is sincerely appreciated and essential to our medical facilities and all our Shriners Children's programs like Dennis', that they serve.

An Update From Shriners International


Shriners International has announced that a new, redesigned membership card is forthcoming as acknowledgement for our nobility who have paid their dues to current, through the 2026 dues year.

Shriners International is excited to announce that the first batch of card shipments is underway and Nobles should begin to receive their cards in the coming weeks (Please allow 3-4 weeks for the first batch to be fully delivered, as they are being sent via 3rd class/bulk postage rates).

This first batch of cards will include all Total Life Members as well as those members who have already paid their 2026 dues. Moving forward, an updated list will be sent for distribution every two weeks once members pay their 2026 dues.

Petals of Hope: Shrine Patient Monthly Story

Brandon's Journey of Renewal

Much like the dogwood tree that bursts into bloom each spring its blossoms a symbol of hope, endurance, and new life-Brandon's story is one of quiet strength and remarkable resilience.

At just 4 years old, Brandon first visited Shriners Children's Greenville for a fractured foot. What seemed like a small bump in the road would later become the first chapter in a much larger journey. At age 6, when a rare virus left him partially paralyzed, Brandon's world shifted. Yet, just like the dogwood bloom that pushes through winter's chill to find the sun, Brandon refused to let adversity keep him from growing.

With every visit to Shriners Children's, Brandon found more than medical support—he found a team that nurtured his spirit, sparked his determination, and helped him reclaim a full and vibrant life. From therapy that doubled as play to braces that gave him the freedom to run and explore, each step forward has been a testament to what hope in action looks like.

Today, Brandon not only thrives—he gives back. Whether speaking on behalf of Shriners or simply living life with joy, he is a living bloom from the tree of care, compassion, and courage that continues to blossom at Shriners Children's Greenville.



My name is Brandon. I am 13, and I have been blessed to experience the care of Shriners Children's Greenville on a variety of levels for many years now. When I was 4, my parents brought me in when I had fractured my foot. The staff was kind and patient, and I was back to playing with my brothers in no time.

When I was 6, a major medical crisis once again had me back at Shriners. In

August 2016, I was paralyzed on my right side when a cold virus attacked my spinal cord. It's called acute flaccid myelitis.

I had played my last baseball game one Saturday, and by the next, I was unable to walk or move my arm. Even sitting up on the side of the hospital bed or other previously simple tasks were now grueling and painful.

I had spent a month in the children's hospital in Greenville, South Carolina, and then several months in Atlanta for intense rehab. When it was time to come home, we once again turned to Shriners Children's. It was a massive blessing to my parents that the hospital was less than 30 minutes from our house.

The physical therapists and occupational therapists worked with me almost daily in those early days. They were great about thinking outside the box to make therapy as fun as possible for me by creatively incorporating sports activities or anything else they thought a little boy would find amusing. They had a sense of humor and would often joke with me.

Therapy wasn't always easy, but they always made it as fun as

possible. The therapy team also was a huge help in advocating for equipment or making sure I got the help I needed with surgery.

In 2007, I had an experimental upper extremity nerve transfer surgery in Philadelphia. That surgery helped me to regain function in my right arm that I otherwise would not have gotten back. We were also back up in Philly on a snowy December day in 2020 for another surgery where Dan Zlotolow, M.D., was able to stabilize my shoulder socket.

Bracing has been another huge component of my care at Shriners. The Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services keeps me moving, literally. Doctors and other families we meet at other places are always asking about my leg brace. It truly is the best. Nate has worked hard to make sure it's durable (I'm kind of hard on my braces because I stay pretty active, thanks to the brace), and has the latest technology available with the joints and other components. I can't walk without my brace, so this has given me independence and a "normal" that I wouldn't have had otherwise. It's a game-changer.

It's not all work, though. I've been able to enjoy the fun parts, too from Halloween parties and anniversary celebrations to speaking events on behalf of Shriners Children's.

It's humbling to see the many different people it takes to make this organization possible. The donations matter. The medical care I get here has made things easier not only for me, but for my parents as well.

Shriners Children's is doing important work with an incredible team of people. Because of Shriners Children's, I am able to enjoy my life to the fullest. I will forever be grateful for their care.

Chaplain's Corner

Pressured By Others?

How frequently are we pressured into doing something by other people. In his book <u>Life Without Limits</u>, Dr. Lloyd J. Ogilve, tells the story of a pastor who, in the space of one week, heard the

following comments from various people:

- A young man said, "My parents have fantastic goals for me to take over the family business. It's not what I want to do, but their pressure is unbearable."
- A college woman said, "I'm being pressured by my boyfriend to live with him before we are married. You know...sort of try it out...to see if we are right for each other."
- A husband said, "My wife is never satisfied. Whatever I do, however much I make, it's never enough."
- A middle-aged wife said, "My husband thinks my faith is silly.
 When I feel his resistance to Christ, I wonder if I'm wrong and confused."
- An elderly woman said, "My sister thinks she has all the answers about the faith and tries to convince me of her point of view."

All of these people have one thing in common. They are being pressured by other people. We all, at one time or another, experience people-pressure. The question is how will it affect our judgment. In Mark 6:26 we find that King Herod was thrown into distress, he knew it was wrong, but because of his oath and his dinner guests, he did not want to refuse another person.

When you find yourself in the middle of a difficult situation, one which requires you to make an important decision, remember first: puzzling problems require conscientious decisions, and second: promises made in haste create great waste; and finally, that the pressures of life and the pressures of other people can affect good judgment.
