

Chloe Stays Active After Hip Surgery at SHC Greenville

Swimming, tennis, dancing and cartwheels are all part of 8-year-old Chloe's everyday world thanks to the excellent treatment she received at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Greenville.



Chloe was born with bi-lateral hip dysplasia, a misalignment of the hip joints. Her treatment journey began at 3-days-old when she was placed in a Pavlik harness - a brace commonly used for infants - for three months. At age 7, surgical intervention was required and Chloe underwent bi-lateral Dega osteotomy.

"If it wasn't corrected as a child, she faced hip replacements as an adult and more limitations in her mobility," said her mother Melissa. "As a child, my legs were bowed from the knee to the ankle and I was a Shriners Hospitals patient. I knew they had Chloe's best interest in mind and wanted the best outcome for her. Now she can do all the things she loves thanks to Shriners Hospitals for Children."

Shriners Hospital Shares Warning After Boy Loses Foot in Lawnmower Accident

GREENVILLE, SC (FOX Carolina) -

Nearly a decade after a little boy was seriously injured in a lawnmower accident, the Greenville Shriner's Hospital is hoping to keep other children safe.

In a Facebook post on Monday, the hospital said in June 2007, an afternoon outside turned into a nightmare for one family.

"Dominic loved to do yard work and cut the grass with his grandpa and plant flowers with his grandma," said his mother, Shelley. "On June 8, 2007, our family learned very quickly just how dangerous a lawn mower can be to a small child."

According to the hospital, Dominic's grandfather was preparing to put a lawnmower away after cutting the grass. Dominic, playing, reportedly ran behind the lawnmower and was a

portedly ran behind the lawnmower and was accidentally run over when the grandfather put the machine in reverse.

Dominic's mother said he suffered a deep cut to his upper right thigh along with multiple other wounds across his body. His left foot was completely severed.

The Greenville Shriners Hospital said Dominic became their patient after undergoing multiple surgeries and eventually received a prosthesis for his left leg. Now, Dominic is a healthy teenager.

"Despite his trauma, he is thriving," an official with the hospital wrote. His mother said Dominic played football this past year and he is soon to be a drummer in the marching band. She said he is "true inspiration to never give up."

The hospital shared the following tips to prevent accidental injuries involving lawnmowers:

- Teach children to never play on or around a lawn mower, even when it is not in use.
- Children under 6 years of age should be kept inside the home while mowing.
- Children should be at least 12 years of age before operating a push lawn mower and at least 16 years of age before operating a riding lawn mower.

Six-year-old Brayden told her grandmother she dreamed of seeing "The Lion King" at the Peace Center, but her grandmother had to tell her it wouldn't be possible.



However, the hospital received a call from a donor at the last minute to find out if a child could use her tickets. Marla Bray said a conflict had come up and she could no longer use her tickets to Wednesday night's show. Knowing about Brayden's love for "The Lion King," the hospital offered the tickets to her and her grandmother.

"It was an awesome night, and we had the best seats in the house. Brayden's eyes stayed glued to the stage all night. I wish I could have taken a picture of her smile while she was watching," Brayden's grandmother, Dawn, said. "We're so grateful to Marla and to Greenville Shriners Hospital for making it possible. It was an evening Brayden will never forget, and neither will I."

Brayden has been a patient at Greenville Shriners Hospital since she was an infant. She was diagnosed with arthrogyposis. It is a non-progressive condition that greatly restricts joint motion and occurs in approximately 1 out of every 3,000 live births. It is one of over 85 orthopaedic conditions treated locally at the hospital.

IN THEIR OWN WORDS: Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital Continues Success

"If you build it, they will come."

It is a line from the 1989 movie Field of Dreams that has been used so often over the years that it now seems cliche – however, it would be hard to argue that the iconic phrase speaks perfectly to the outstanding success of the Shriners Hospitals for Children Orthopaedics Clinic at Niswonger Children's Hospital.

Prior to opening the clinic, Greenville Shriners Hospital averaged 91 outpatient visits per month from Eastern Tennessee and Western Virginia; today in Johnson City, Dr. Brandon Green sees approximately 168 appointments per month – a remarkable 85 percent increase in the number of outpatient clinic visits.

Similarly, before we opened our doors in Johnson City in October 2016, we had 674 active patients identified in 15 nearby counties; now, there are 951 active patients from the same counties in the region. That's a

meaningful 41 percent increase in the number of children we are serving from the area versus prior to the opening of the first remote, daily practice in the Shriners Hospitals for Children system.

To help support Dr. Green and provide the best care to this growing patient base, we recently hired Alison Herrig, CPNP. With years of pediatric primary and specialty care experience, Alison brings a tremendous amount of value to the practice. Under the mentorship of Dr. Green and the medical staff based in Greenville, she will fine-tune her pediatric orthopaedic expertise and will increasingly contribute to the success of the clinic and the positive outcomes of patients.

We have provided more children with access to life-changing treatment and we are committed to building higher on the solid foundation of care we have created for the kids in that underserved region. Truly, we have honored our mission.





A Newberry County man is walking to raise funds for the organization that gave him the ability to walk at all.

Ronald Brown will trek 500 miles through South Carolina - eventually completing the Palmetto Trail that spans across the state.



It's all in an effort to raise funds for Shriner's Hospitals for Children,

Patients Benefit from Advanced Pediatric and Fluid Care

New location joins pediatric orthopaedic expertise with speciality and subspeciality care for children with complex conditions

Once she warms up to new faces, Zayleigh will talk the ear off a willing listener. But to the astonishment of her caregivers and doctors, the 10-year-old chatterbox never complains about the pain caused by her complex medical condition.

"She is one of the strongest children I've ever met in my life," Aundria Caldwell, her mother, said. "There's so much that grown-ups need to learn (from her)."

Zayleigh, a long-time patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children Medical Center – Lexington, was born with hemiplegia cerebral palsy (CP), a brain impairment that impacts a person's ability to control movement and posture. Traveling from her hometown of Morristown, Tennessee, Zayleigh has received ongoing treatment and numerous surgical interventions at Shriners Medical Center to improve her mobility and quality of life. When her head started slumping to the side earlier this year, Caldwell thought the weakness in her neck was related to muscle spasms caused by CP.

In April, Caldwell took Zayleigh to Kentucky Children's Hospital (KCH) in Lexington, Kentucky, for a follow-up appointment with ear, nose and throat surgeon Kenneth Iverson, M.D., who removed an abscess in Zayleigh's throat in January. Concerned about the possibility of an

ongoing infection despite surgical and medical treatment, Iverson conducted an MRI, finding instead overlapping bones in Zayleigh's neck. He called Zayleigh's orthopaedic surgeons, Ryan Muchow, M.D., and Scott Riley, M.D., who were located across the street at the new Shriners Medical



Center on the University of Kentucky (UK) HealthCare campus.

The surgeons scheduled a surgical procedure to put Zayleigh in halo traction, a long-term therapy to straighten her neck, the following week. Before her surgery, Zayleigh met with Shriners Medical Center nurse Anna Gayle Parke to learn about what to expect during the halo therapy before the surgery. She then transferred to KCH as an inpatient, and after surgery received frequent check-ins from Parke, who was located across the street at Shriners Medical Center.

The proximity of the new Shriners Medical Center, which is adjoined by an overpass to the University of Kentucky Chandler Hospital and accessible to inpatient care at Kentucky Children's Hospital, enabled seamless inpatient treatment and post-surgical care for Zayleigh. In addition, Zayleigh benefited from continuity of care, seeing familiar pediatric orthopaedic surgeons who have monitored her condition for years, while also having access to advanced pediatric specialists at KCH.

Shriners Medical Center donors, patients, medical center staff and doctors, and UK HealthCare leaders dedicated the new Lexington Shriners Medical Center during a ceremony on May 21. While health care providers at Shriners Medical Center and KCH have collaborated for decades, the opening of the new facility will accommodate follow-up appointments for patients seeing multiple doctors for complex medi-

cal conditions. Ultimately, families and patients like Zayleigh will benefit from having fluid accessibility and proximity to multiple experts and medical resources at both facilities.

"Shriners Medical Center moving to UK HealthCare campus allows for seamless care to occur across institutional boundaries," Muchow said. "The patients benefit tremendously when two excellent institutions combine mission and service to advance the pediatric orthopaedic care."

Shriners Medical Center has operated in Lexington since 1926. Transitioning from the former location on Richmond Road, Shriners Medical Center occupies 60,000 square feet of space on the bottom three floors of the new facility on South Limestone. UK HealthCare leases the top two floors for ophthalmology services. The new Lexington Shriners Medical Center includes a motion analysis center, 20 patient exam rooms, two surgical suites, a rehabilitation gymnasium, prosthetics and orthot-

ics department, therapy rooms and interactive artwork. The energy-efficient building has geothermal heating and cooling, LED lighting and occupancy sensors, and automated equipment and controls.

UK HealthCare and Shriners Medical Center have forged a long-standing collaborative relationship through years of service to Kentucky's children. Pediatric specialists in the fields of orthopaedics, anesthesia and rehabilitation serve on the medical staff of both organizations.

Mark D. Birdwhistell, vice president for administration and external affairs at UK HealthCare, called the new facility a "win" for UK HealthCare, Shriners Medical Center and the Lexington community.

"The building we are dedicating today will allow us to collaborate in a whole new way – bringing together Shriners Medical Center's pediatric orthopaedic expertise and the Kentucky Children's Hospital's specialty and subspecialty care for children with complex conditions," Birdwhistell said.

A Message from Your Chairman of the Board of Trustees

Dear Fellow Nobles,

Sometimes it may seem like Shriners Hospitals for Children is limited by only having a physical presence in 16 states and one hospital each for all of Canada and Mexico. However, while Shriners Hospitals for Children only has locations in North America, the health care system has a global reach and impact.

The majority of our hospitals hold regularly scheduled outreach clinics that extend the mission of Shriners Hospitals far beyond our 22 locations. Our physicians and clinicians routinely travel to provide medical care to both new and current patients and, perhaps even more importantly, to share their expertise with the local medical communities. Our health care system offers approximately 120 outreach clinics annually in a wide range of locations, both local and international. Regularly scheduled outreach clinics are held in approximately 80 locations in 18 countries, including the Dominican Republic, Honduras, Panama, Cyprus and Guam.

Staff from our Springfield hospital has been providing orthopaedic care to the children of Cyprus since 1979. Every October, a team of physicians and clinicians travel to the island to examine prospective patients and provide follow-up care to current patients. This past year, more than 350 patients were seen over a four-day period Over the years, more than 15,000 Cypriot children have received care at the clinics, and more than 3,000 of those have come to the Springfield hospitals for treatment.

Expanding Local Efforts

Many of our hospitals are also expanding outreach efforts at the local level. For example, our Canada hospital regularly holds outreach clinics in eight locations throughout the country. And our Portland hospital holds clinics in Anchorage, Alaska.



In addition, some of our hospitals are establishing offsite clinics in conjunction with local health care providers. For example, our Greenville hospital established clinics allied with Park Ridge Health in Henderson-ville, North Carolina; Niswonger Children's Hospital in Johnson City, Tennessee; AnMed Health in Anderson, South Carolina and Beaufort Memorial in Bluffton, South Carolina. The Bluffton and Anderson locations are open one day a month, Hendersonville is available two days a month, and the Johnson City clinic is open daily.

The Bluffton, Anderson and Hendersonville locations operate much like outreach clinics, with staff from the Greenville hospital traveling there to see patients in leased space, while the Johnson City clinic is a true offsite extension of the Greenville Shriners Hospital, staffed fulltime and housed in a facility leased by Shriners Hospitals.

Currently, approximately 150 patients are being seen each month at the

Johnson City location; 80 percent of them could not have traveled to the Greenville Shriners Hospital for care. Clearly, we are both reaching more children who need our help, and meeting a real need in local communities. As we become embedded in and part of more communities, we believe our ability to reach more patients will ex-



pand considerably. In addition, by working with local health care providers, we also protect our service lines and our patient base.

So far in 2017, the Greenville hospital has had more than 800 patient visits through its various outreach and offsite efforts – with each visit saving patients and families both time and all the logistics involved in traveling.

Caring for the Children of Northern Mexico

Another full-time outreach clinic is the one we established in Tijuana, Mexico in 2014.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children Ambulatory Clinic – Tijuana, which is under the auspices of our Los Angeles hospital, is a partnership with Hospitals Infantile de las Californias (HIC) that provides orthopaedic and plastic surgery care to children from Northern Mexico. In 2016, programs to specifically treat spina bifida and osteogenesis imperfecta were added. Establishing a presence in Tijuana allows Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena to treat children closer to home, eliminating the need for them to travel back and forth across the border. We are confident that the collaborative effort will lead to greater efficiency and improved care for children in the Tijuana area.

In 2016, the clinic provided more than 450 outpatient surgeries, and accommodated more than 6,000 outpatient visits.

Using Technology to Reach More Children

Another effort that expands our ability to reach patients is telehealth. With today's communication capabilities, it is much easier to provide

follow-up care closer to home. Using the Telehealth Care Network can ease the burden and cost of traveling long distances to see a medical team at Shriners Hospitals. Benefits of telehealth include reduced time away from home and school for patients and their families, while the same level of excellent care and attention is provided.



Telehealth, quite simply, enables Shriners Hospitals for Children to come directly to the patient. We can add strategically located clinics so that we can provide care wherever needed. Telehealth patients receive our state-of-the-art care via video conferencing.

Shriners Hospitals for Children began offering telehealth services in May of 2016. Initially, telehealth services were offered in conjunction with our Salt Lake City, Galveston and Philadelphia hospitals. In 2016, we provided care to 1,447 children through telehealth, reducing the travel miles by approximately 1.2 million for these patients.

The program will continue to be phased in over the next three years, and will ultimately include all 22 Shriners Hospitals. A total of eight is expected to be added in 2017.

All of these efforts have a single goal: to help us reach as many kids who need our help as we possibly can, as efficiently as possible. We are making great progress and using as many innovative models as possible to achieve this goal, and I am very proud of everyone involved in making all these efforts successful.

We will continue to do all we can to extend the reach of Shriners Hospitals for Children, and offer our unique brand of compassionate, excellent care, always offered regardless of the ability to pay, to the children and families who need us - wherever they may be.

Thank you for all your efforts in support of the mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children.
