race, this is the one to attend! We then head off to southern Georgia for our ride in the mountains for our Potentate's summer trip.



Greetings to All Nobles, Ladies and Friends, As

always, I want to personally thank each of you for being a part of Oasis and what all of you are doing to make our Oasis Shrine

Headquarters greater than anyone's in the world.

What a great month we have had since being able to get out and enjoy our last outing. As I have covered in past award-winning issues of the Desert Dust, the happenings around Oasis activities are growing stronger and stronger each week. We are almost there, moving forward and getting better and better each day.

First, let talk about Oasis and about the Imperial session that took place in Houston, Texas over the week of July 4th. Man, what a great feeling to enter a state that is fully open for business and welcoming to all who came. For some of you new folks who are not sure about Oasis Shrine Headquarters in Charlotte, let me tell you, Oasis ranked number two in membership in the world, and for the first time ever that I know of, number two in giving. At Imperial the preceeding year's contribution is presented to the outgoing Imperial Potentate, so in 2020 your Oasis raised \$957,643 and presented a large check (*created by Noble Tim Nelson of PIP in Asheboro*) in that amount on Tuesday July 6th. We were out-raised by an Atlanta Temple which raised 2.3 million. We are still attempting to find out if there was an endowment of some kind since they have never given that amount before.

On Wednesday mid-morning, I was able to offer one of my best OJ Simpson impressions during Imperial. Noble Tim Nelson created a second large presentation check for incoming First Lady, Debby Bailey in the amount of \$100,000 for her project. And it had to be on-stage in record time. All I can say is thank you to Noble Harold Davis and my wife for the quick relay of checks that took place in the hotel hallway. The checks were presented on time, no one was seriously injured in the process, and the old man still has it. The next closest Shrine Center in giving was \$60,000. Oasis, you did it again, blowing all others out of the water, Great Job!

We spent the Tuesday morning manning the "Carolina 2023" booth in the Shrine Mart. We had

a lot of interest in Nobles and vendors looking forward to Charlotte in July of 2023...and so should all of you. Each Oasis Club and Unit should be preparing to be at our 2023 session in full display. Ill. Sir H. Mike Cook is putting together one heck of a Shrine experience for all who attend from all over the world.

I do want to thank Nobles Harold Davis and Al Clegg along with Ladies Susan and Joyce on their work serving Oasis at Imperial.

Now on to SASA in Myrtle Beach. Several of you are seeing for the first time ever each Noble who is attending **MUST** register themselves. This is a SASA rule and not an Oasis rule. SASA came up with this due to not having the manpower to input each name manually. Sad to say, but I believe this is the way of the future moving forward. Again, let me remind everyone that Oasis will reimburse all members who arrive in Myrtle Beach **and parade**. You must parade to get reimbursed.

Second, if you are the President/Captain of a Club or Unit that is parading at SASA in Myrtle Beach, you will need to contact Noble Director Jimmy Burgess at jimmyburgess@oasisshriners.org with your roster of who has signed up to parade. Jimmy will take the time and register all parading clubs and units at SASA. Remember, Jimmy Burgess will register parade units all at once, so get that information in to him as soon as you have it.

Please take some time to look at the information flyer about Oasis's first ever Rodeo event in Waynesville, NC on Friday October 22nd, and Saturday October 23rd. We are still looking for volunteers to help in all aspects. This event brings out competitors from the very best high school rodeo participants in the south. This is a great way to support youth rodeo and your Oasis Shrine Headquarters all at the same time. He knows exactly which way to go and if she doesn't go the way he thinks she should, he lets her know about it really quick. His mother went on to say as they get closer the more excited Trey gets. Once they pull into the parking deck it becomes

very hard for Trey to control his emotions and once they walk into the hospital he bursts with excitement. She also said that the staff at Greenville is just as excited to see Trey as he is to see them. At the end of his appointment and it's time to go home, Trey doesn't want to leave. Dawn just kept bragging about all the good treatment and the wonderful experiences that they encounter each time they go to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

After our conversation, I invited Dawn and Trey to our cruise-in. I thought it would be a nice thing for our attendees, car owners and all the good people that support The Oasis Shriners Keystone Kops to be able to hear Trey's story firsthand and see what their money goes to support. They came out on June 30 and it was nothing short of spectacular. Dawn was handed the microphone and began to tell the same story as mentioned above and it went great.




